

- The Parish tree scheme is still ongoing but is expected to plant / deliver in excess of 221 trees in 2018/19.



Government consultation

- The council is responding:
- ^a 1. Felling street trees: Extra powers an overreaction. [We encourage highways to replace and plant new trees].
 - 2. Reporting of tree felling and replanting: Our own trees are recorded, but planning records are not readily available
 - 3. Tree and woodland strategies: Contained within our Nature Conservation Strategy and Local Plan Part 2.
 - 4. Additional powers for the Forestry Commission: No Comment
