## **SUMMARY OF MAIN POINTS:**

Bridgford hall is the jewel in the crown of West Bridgford park. It is extremely unfortunate that during the last few years the area beneath the canopy has suffered from anti-social behaviour - albeit mostly at a low level. The majority of wedding photographs taken include the entrance to the Registry Office on the ground floor of the hall and so it is essential that any shutter system fitted, when open, does not spoil the character and appearance of this handsome listed building, and when closed, are as unobtrusive as possible whilst performing the task they are designed to do.

The proposed shutter system, whilst having an impact on the aesthetic of the hall entrance when lowered, is an appropriate solution to protecting the canopied area from anti-social behaviour when this well- loved, listed building is not in use.

Support the recommendation that listed building consent be granted subject to the conditions listed in the report.
