



The NPI for Rushcliffe, Inspector Cuthbert has been consulted and his comments from 24 July 2025 are below:

My opinion for the PSPO conditions are below;

- Refusal to stop drinking alcohol or hand over containers.

Response: I would like this to remain. It assists in tackling ASB, youth and adult alcohol related problems, and could assist officers tackling alcohol related issues which arise from the football and cricket events too.

- Refusal to remove any items left or believed to be left on land when required to do so by an authorised officer.

Response: I am not supportive of this element of the PSPO, as it is geared towards targeting homeless people with a fine which they will never be in a position to pay, and removal of their property which is not something which ethically is an effective use of police resource. This is something which may be addressed via the changes in legislation

- Refusal to leave the location specified when given a direction to do so by an authorised officer, subject to conditions for use:

Response: I have no strong opinion either way on this one, with the exception that it may be more beneficial for RBC staff/agents acting on their behalf as a tool to disperse groups without having to call for Police assistance. Police can relatively simply obtain a dispersal order if we need one, or put on a pre-emptive dispersal order in anticipation of an issue for a 48 hour period.... So we have some police powers anyway, but the PSPO could give security staff a power to disperse, which could be useful for them

- Prohibition on begging for money or for any other item whether expressly or impliedly in a manner that causes or is likely to cause nuisance, annoyance, fear or distress to any other person.

Response: Again, with the likely changes to the vagrancy act, this may become obsolete, so no requirement to retain this element on our behalf, unless it is useful to keep in to support the security staff

- Prohibition on spitting, urinating or defecating on land or street furniture;

Response: happy for this to remain, however spitting is not something which I believe is proportionate to include.

- This PSPO also includes two new areas covering open spaces around Lyme Park Pond and Broadstone Close Pond in Compton Acres not included in the preceding or Rushcliffe.

Response: No change
